College of Fellows Keynote Speaker and Salon del Rey COF Installation

College of Fellows keynote speakers, Camila Mileto and Fernando Vegas, are architects and professors at the Universitat Politècnica of València (Spain), where they teach architectural conservation. They have been guest lecturers at the Universities of Venice and Palermo (Italy), Cordoba (Argentina) and the University of Pennsylvania (USA). As directors of the journal *Loggia*, both have published extensively on architectural conservation, have received several international awards for their research projects and built work on architectural conservation. Mileto and Vegas have directed several studies, projects and interventions for the preservation of the Alhambra of Granade, among other monuments in Spain.
